POSITION:

Assistant Professor of Education - Elementary Mathematics Methods- The Department of Teacher Education invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor to begin Fall 2020. Candidates for this position must be able to advance the College of Education, Kinesiology, and Social Work's mission to develop diverse educational leaders who can meet the needs of a multicultural and multilingual society. We particularly seek candidates with a specialty in mathematics education, who have a passion for preparing future teachers from an asset-oriented approach that is driven in equity, inclusion, and social-justice. The assignment will include teaching mathematics methodology courses in the Multiple Subject (Elementary Teaching) Credential program in the Department of Teacher Education.

The Assistant Professor will facilitate teacher candidates' development in teaching mathematics to K-8 students. Mathematics Methods course responsibilities include: Develop teacher candidates' understanding to teach the progression of the state-adopted academic content standards and applicable English Language Development Standards for students in mathematics; model and explain how beginning teachers can develop students' knowledge, skills and academic language; teach appropriate use of problem-solving processes, reasoning and proof, communication, representation, and real-world connections; guide teacher candidates' application of UDL principals to support students with special needs to access the curriculum. Develop beginning teachers' understanding of mathematical proficiency, including strategic competence, conceptual understanding, and productive disposition. Teach practices for using multiple approaches to solve problems, student collaboration, and development of the Standards for Mathematical Practice.

All faculty members are required to supervise student teaching/fieldwork, advising responsibilities, engage in scholarship and provide service to the department/college/university. Assignment may include teaching and advising in the Master of Arts program, and teaching at off-site centers. Additional responsibilities include program development and implementation; development of contracts and grants; development of university/school partnerships; chairing Masters theses; and service to community, county, district agencies and professional organizations.

**MINIMUM
QUALIFICATIONS:**

1. Doctorate in Education. ABD considered with completion by the time of appointment.
2. Demonstrated expertise in the teaching of mathematics in a multiple subject assignment, enabling students to progress in learning mathematics content and practices.
3. Demonstrated expertise in teaching mathematics to K-8 students, with clear connection to mathematics academic content standards and development of English Language Development (ELD) standards.
4. A minimum of five full years of teaching experiences in a K-8 classroom as the teacher of record in culturally and linguistically diverse classrooms.
5. Strong evidence of teaching effectiveness (Note: Applicant must include evaluations of prior teaching experience).
6. Strong generic training with skills and experience in assessment, curriculum, and instruction of students.
7. Potential for or record of scholarly/creative activity related to mathematics education.

**PREFERRED
QUALIFICATIONS:**

1. Knowledge of the California Common Core State Standards for Mathematics.
2. Experience teaching in classrooms/programs in linguistically and socially diverse classrooms with a substantive percentage of emergent bilinguals.
3. Knowledge of UDL principles and applications to K-8 mathematics instruction.
4. Knowledge of California credentialing regulations, and local, state, and national trends.
5. Experience teaching and supervising adults, preferably some of which was at the University level.
6. Experience with research design and methodology.
7. Knowledge of uses of technology in education.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CLEARANCE NOTICE
