Position Summary:

The School of Education invites applications for an Assistant Professor in the School of Education within the College of Education, Criminal Justice, Human Services, and Information Technology (CECH) at the University of Cincinnati. Primary responsibilities will reside in Middle Childhood Education, and Curriculum and Instruction. The position is expected to begin August 15, 2020.

The successful candidate will teach undergraduate mathematics methods courses (primarily focused on early and middle grades) for general and special educators; teach on-line graduate courses in the Curriculum and Instruction Master's Program and STEM Certificate; teach doctoral courses in the Curriculum Studies and Teacher Education Ph.D. strand; advise and mentor undergraduate and graduate students; maintain an active program of research and scholarly activity, and publish in peer-reviewed journals in an area of elementary or middle grades mathematics education; provide service to the university, school, public schools, and professional community; participate in program review, program assessment, and accreditation activities including data analysis; contribute to the mission of the university, college, and school; and other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Doctoral degree from an accredited institution in Mathematics Education, Elementary Education, or Curriculum and Instruction. Other related areas may be considered if candidate reasonably meets position qualifications. All applicants must have a doctoral degree by August 1, 2020.
- Appropriate teaching experience or license in Elementary or Middle Childhood Mathematics Education.
- Expertise in diversity, inclusion, and assessment in K-8 classrooms.
- Demonstrated capacity for successful teaching in higher education.
- Demonstrated capacity for successful scholarship.
- Demonstrated capacity for contribution to the service expectations.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Three or more years of successful teaching or coaching experiences in upper elementary or middle education (preferably, grades 3 through 6) in public or private settings in the U.S. or internationally.
- Scholarly research activity related to mathematics education at the elementary or middle level.
- Expertise in Special Education inclusion in general education classrooms at the elementary or middle level.
- Experience in grant writing and/or grant implementation.
- Experience teaching elementary, middle, or special education candidates in higher education.
- Effective leadership experience as demonstrated by coaching, program development, program coordination, or similar activities.
- Experience in program review, assessment, and accreditation activities including data analysis.
- Demonstrated effectiveness working on collaborative teams.
- Knowledge, experience, or research that contributes to the university, college, and school mission statements.

Application Requirements:

All applicants should submit:

- A one-page cover letter describing how they meet the minimum and preferred qualifications described above
- Curriculum vitae
- A list of three names of professional references (complete with title, address, email address, and phone number)
- A one- to two-page research statement describing their scholarly agenda and including plans for the next 5 years
- A one- to two-page teaching statement describing their approach; evidence of success including student evaluations rating from courses in higher education [if available]; and their beliefs about diversity and inclusion in both higher education, and K-12 settings
- One to three scholarly publications [if available]
